

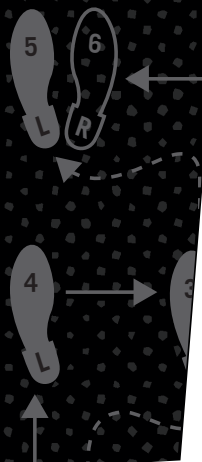
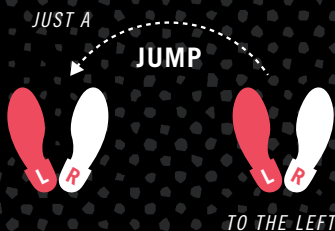



***Don't dream it, be it...***



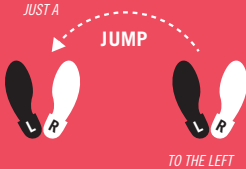

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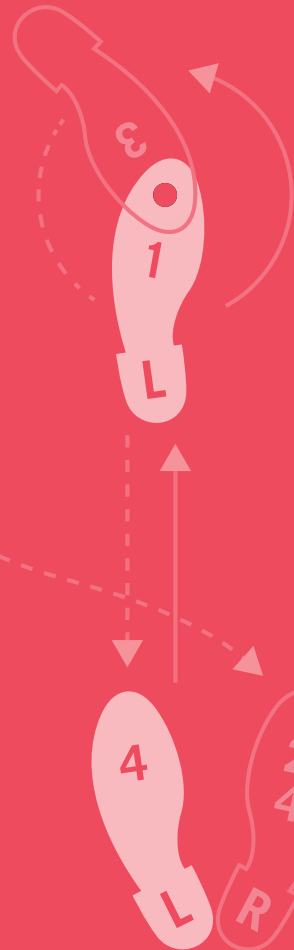

# TONIGHT'S ENTERTAINMENT

## MARGARET CHO

Margaret Cho was born and raised in San Francisco. Racing toward adulthood as fast as she could to escape the constant bullying she endured, Margaret began writing jokes at 14 and professionally performing at age 16. Getting picked on, and not having a feeling of belonging, is something she still feels very deeply despite her success.

Soon after starting her stand-up career, Margaret won a comedy contest where first prize was opening for Jerry Seinfeld. Still in her early twenties, she hit the college circuit. Arsenio Hall introduced her to late night audiences, Bob Hope put her on a prime time special and, seemingly overnight, Margaret Cho became a national celebrity.

Her controversial and short-lived ABC sitcom, *All-American Girl* (1994) soon followed. Oddly, while chosen because of who she was, the powers-that-be decided they preferred for Margaret to “tone it down” for the show. “For fear of being too ‘ethnic,’ the show got so watered down for television that by the end, it was completely lacking in the essence of what I wanted to accomplish.”

The experience was a traumatic one, and Margaret developed an eating disorder as a response to criticism about her body. She was so obsessive in her goal to try to be what she thought others wanted, that she landed in the hospital with kidney failure. Throughout this period, Margaret continued performing to sold-out audiences in comedy clubs, theaters, and college campuses, working to channel her anger into something more positive.

In 1999, her groundbreaking, off-Broadway, one-woman show, *I'm The One That I Want*, toured the country to national acclaim and was made into a best-selling book and feature film of the same name. In 2001, after the success of her first tour, Margaret launched *Notorious C.H.O.*, a smash-hit 37-city national tour that culminated in a sold-out concert at Carnegie Hall.

In 2003, Margaret embarked on her third sold-out national tour, *Revolution*; the CD recording was nominated for a Grammy for Comedy Album of the Year. In 2007, Margaret hit the road with Cyndi Lauper, Debbie Harry, and Erasure, along with indie faves The Dresden Dolls and The Cliks, to host the *True Colors Tour*, benefiting the Human Rights Campaign.



Margaret returned to TV in 2008 with the VH1 series, *The Cho Show*. *The Cho Show* followed Margaret, her real parents, and her eccentric entourage through a series of bold and outrageous experiences, shaped by Margaret's "anything goes" brand of stand-up.

The aptly titled *Beautiful* came next, exploring the good, bad, and ugly in beauty, and the marketers who shape our world. The year 2010 culminated with another high honor, a second Grammy Award nomination for "Comedy Album of the Year" for *Cho Dependent*, her humorous collection of music, featuring collaborations with Fiona Apple, Andrew Bird, Grant Lee Phillips, Tegan & Sara, Ben Lee, and more.

Margaret's creative side moved ahead at full speed with an Emmy nomination for "Best Guest Performance" on *Thirty Rock*. 2015 brought Margaret back to the stand-up stage, where she filmed her Showtime special/DVD *psyCHO* at the historic Gramercy Theatre in New York City.

In 2016, the three-time Grammy and Emmy nominee released her next studio album, *American Myth*, on her Clownery label. The song that set the internet on fire "(I Want To) Kill My Rapist" was called by *Salon* magazine "A new anthem." Margaret spoke about the song saying, "I'm a victim, and now a survivor, of sexual abuse and rape, and I think it's really hard to talk about it. I think having a song to perform live will allow others to talk about it. It's a huge issue, and this was cathartic for me."

Margaret has never turned away from the causes that are important to her. She is very active in anti-racism, anti-bullying, advocating for the homeless and gay rights campaigns, PFLAG, and LA Pride, and has been recognized for her unwavering dedication. She was the recipient of the Victory Fund's Leadership Award and the first-ever "Best Comedy Performance Award" at the 2007 Asian Excellence Awards. She also received the "First Amendment Award" from the ACLU of Southern California, and the "Intrepid Award" from the National Organization for Women (NOW). Margaret has been honored by GLAAD, American Women in Radio and Television, the Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund, the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force (NGLTF), the Asian American Legal Defense and Education Fund (AALDEF), PFLAG, and LA Pride, who gave Margaret a "Lifetime Achievement Award" for leaving a lasting imprint on the LGBT community.

## STAR AMERASU

Star Amerasu is a multi-disciplinary artist, and her music project Ah-Mer-Ah-Su has been lauded by media publications. Star's debut album *Star* was voted by Billboard Music critics as one of the top 20 LGBT albums of 2018. She grew into her artistry in San Francisco and Oakland, and has been performing in music, theater, and dance pieces since 2012. Her most recent musical release, *Incandescent Body* (made possible by funding from the Women's Audio Mission), was released in September of 2019 and featured orchestrated selections from Star's discography. The premiere of this work, in collaboration with *Post:Ballet* and *The Living Earth Show*, culminated in a two-day dance, music, and theatrical event.
